Holt County gas stations finally follow regional gas pump price decline

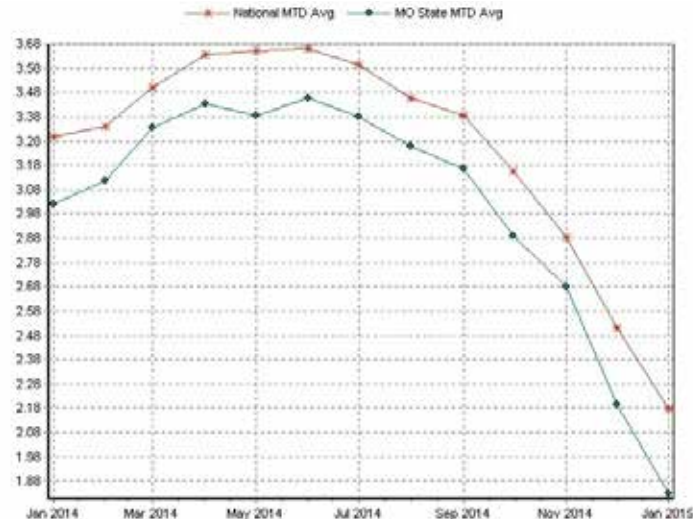
Stations post under \$2/gallon for first time in five years

Missouri is the Show Me State; showing the nation how low gasoline can get. According to AAA Monthly Gas Report, Missouri's average price for unleaded gasoline is \$1.758 per gallon as of Tuesday, Jan. 13, down from an average of \$2.291 one month ago. The average price nationwide is \$2.11 per gallon of unleaded, plunging from \$3.312 one year ago. The highest price for one gallon of unleaded gas in Missouri was \$3.945 in July, 2008.

Springfield, MO, shows the lowest price for a metropolitan area at \$1.689 per gallon, followed by St. Joseph, Kansas City and St. Louis running from \$1.719 to \$1.749.

Local gas stations in and around Holt County finally plunged prices to as low as \$1.799 as of Tuesday, Jan. 13, at some area stations, with other stations still above that price at \$1.849 to \$1.899. Lower volume turnover often catches smaller stations having to use up more expensive fuel before following the downward trend.

The nation is waiting and watching to see where the gasoline prices will bottom out. In the meantime, everyone is enjoying filling up the family and company vehicles and putting more and more money into their pockets.

Chile native, Vicente Soto, traveled to Mound City last August to become acclimated to the area before beginning the school year at Mound City R-2. Host parents, Donnie and Kim Ireland, welcomed Vicente into their home for ten months of school, travel and exposure to Missouri culture.

Donnie, Kim and daughter, Sydney, have enjoyed watching Vicente participate in school activities and school sports. Vicente, an avid soccer player in Chile, found his niche on the football field for the Mound City Panthers. He became a kicker for the team and booted extra points and field goals.

In basketball, Vicente plays the forward position and states that he has learned quite a bit about the sport. He is looking forward to the Panthers' track season, thinking that he would like to run the 800 meter run, the 4 x 800 relay and the 400 meter dash. Like football and basketball, Vicente has never run track but he is eager to try it. He is not excluding an attempt at high jump, discus and other field events to satisfy his goal of participating in all aspects of high school in the United States.

This past Christmas, Vicente experienced new and exciting traditions. In Chile, Viejo Pascuero, a jolly old man in a red suit and with a white beard, visits children's homes at midnight on Christmas Eve, leaving presents behind. Vicente says that part of Christmas is very much like the Santa Claus tradition he experienced in the Ireland home this year. As in his native home, family time played a big part in the host family's celebration. Vicente reminisced about the big family dinner his Chilean family certainly enjoyed. He was in awe at all of the elaborate decorations on homes and businesses in Mound City. This year is the first time Vicente has seen snow except when traveling to the mountains of Chile for a family ski

trip.

Vicente has experienced many firsts during his time in Mound City, but perhaps his favorite time was with Blake Shiflett on his first trip to a pond to fish. Blake made Vicente bait his own hook and the fishing experience began. Vicente caught five or six fish and declared the fish saved from the frying pan as he was not going to touch the fish, much less clean them.

The Ireland family took Vicente on a family vacation to South Dakota where he saw Mount Rushmore. He truly enjoyed that awe-inspiring monument and national park. Vicente was also a guest of his American family at a Kansas City Chiefs' game this past fall. "It was amazing to see so many people and everywhere I looked it was red," Vicente remarked. He hopes to see a baseball game before he leaves this summer.

Back home at Mound City R-2, Vicente's favorite class is American History. He states that Mr. Osburn makes it so interesting to learn. Vicente noted that when he began the school year he had difficulty understanding the teachers and students much of time. He feels that he has made strides in the English language and hopes that others can understand him better, too.

The Mound City R-2 high school secretary, Mrs. Lisa Loucks, pointed out that Vicente is always happy and eager to do new things. Still time to file for board seats

Filing for municipal and school board elections started Tuesday, Dec. 16, and continues until Tuesday, Jan. 20. Elections will take place on Tuesday, April 7. With a few more days to file, most schools and municipalities have received candidates for the open positions.

At Mound City R-2, incumbent board member Karma Metzgar and Justin Courtney have filed to be on the ballot for the two open positions in Mound City.

Craig R-3 reports that no one has stepped up to fill the two open board member slots and the unexpired two-year term for the Craig, MO, school.

Brian Williams, incumbent Jim Kelly and Jason Kurtz have filed the necessary papers to be put on the ballot for the two open board member positions at South Holt R-1 in Oregon, MO.

Nodaway-Holt R-7, in Graham, MO, reports that incumbent Bob Saxton and Kenneth Shewey, Jr., have thrown their hats in the ring for the two open board member positions.

In municipal elections, Mound City has not received a filing for the North Ward position. Jason Biermann has filed for the South Ward opening.

The city of Oregon, MO, has received filings for both ward openings. Paxton Crumbaker has filed for the West Ward and Kent Bohart is seeking the East Ward position.

Big Lake Village, MO, has not received filings for the two trustee positions.

Maitland, MO, City Hall reports that Dale Grasty has filed for the North Ward opening and Terry Schwebach has filed for the South Ward opening. Mark Russell is seeking the Mayor's position.

The city of Craig, MO, has two alderman positions and the mayor position up for election. Rhonda Hunziger has filed for the mayoral race. Michael Blythe and Rinney Law will face off for one of the At Large alderman races, while incumbent Karen Miller and Angela Woods will vie for the other At Large alderman position.

Agricultural updates from Holt and Atchison County Extensions scheduled

The University of Missouri (MU) Agricultural (Ag) Extension staff will be presenting a series of morning meetings for area growers and livestock producers. The Holt County Ag update will be held Thursday, Jan. 22, at the T.J. Hall Building in Oregon, MO. The Atchison County Ag update will be held Friday, Jan. 23, at the MU Extension Office in Rock Port, MO. Each session will begin at 8 a.m., with private pesticide applicator training, followed by updates from the various subject areas of Extension staff. The meetings will conclude at noon.

Private pesticide applicator training will begin at 8 a.m. For the applicator training, a training manual is required for licensing and a fee is charged for the manual. Participants with an old manual may bring it so they will not be charged for a new manual. This training will end at 9:30 a.m. Growers who do not need a license can benefit by attending this session.

Updates will begin with Wayne Flanary, Extension Agronomist, presenting ways to maximize returns on investment of crop input dollars. "Our Ag advisory committee wants us to focus on economics as we move into the 2015 growing season," comments Flanary.

Bob Kelly and Randa Doty, Ag Business Specialists, will be addressing the Farm Bill 2014 - "Now what should producers do?"

Amie Schleicher, Livestock Specialist, will discuss opportunities and issues for beef producers in 2015.

Jim Crawford, Natural Resource Engineer, will present results from the Graves-Chapple Research Center near Corning, MO, such as the closing wheel study, corn maturity study and others.

Tom Fowler, Horticulture Specialist, will end the program with a discussion of agroforestry practices for field and forest.

The order of the program may change depending on speakers' schedules during the day of the meeting.

Ice fishing safety

With the continued arctic weather the Midwest has been experiencing, it undoubtedly feels like it is time to head to the ice to do a little fishing. When done safely, a morning or afternoon of ice fishing can be a great cure for those winter blues. It has always been said, "No ice is safe ice". So with this in mind, take a moment to reflect on some basic ice fishing safety tips before heading out.

First, dress appropriately. It is winter and with the ever changing Missouri weather ice fishermen need to be prepared. Dressing in layers provides the best protection against old man winter. This can be done in several ways. There should always be a base layer of "Polypropylene" (wicking material) next to the skin and a wind/water proof outer layer. In cold weather, wool provides the best insulation because it provides some warmth even when wet. The feet will be on the ice most of the time, insulated boots are a must, as are a warm hat and gloves.

Second, know the ice. There is no such thing as "safe ice". At the very minimum, there should be at least four inches

of clear blue ice or eight inches of "honey combed" or black ice to hold a single person ice fishing. If there will be more than one person in the immediate area, six inches of clear blue ice is recommended for safety. Always test and re-test the ice thickness at the shore or from a dock by drilling a test hole. This should be done before setting foot on the ice. Once on the ice, if something does not feel right, go with instinct and get off of the ice. It is better to be safe than sorry. Ice that appears dark/milky colored may be "rotten ice". Rotten or weak ice is caused by a number of factors including current (from large lakes, wind, streams, rivers, springs), snow cover, underwater objects that attract heat from the sun, and areas heavily used by other ice fishermen.

Third, take a buddy. As with

most outdoor sports it is safer and more rewarding to take a friend along. It is better for a novice ice fisherman to go with a friend who has ice fishing experience. Always tell a friend or family member the location of the pond and a probable time for the return home. Be sure and stick to these plans. If something does happen, help will get there in the shortest amount of time possible.


Finally, take the appropriate safety equipment, including: 1) A personal flotation device (PFD) or lifejacket for each person participating. 2) A set of "ice picks" or a board with a nail in it (used to help grip the ice and pull out of the ice upon falling through). 3) A rope or a throw bag to assist another individual who has fallen through the ice (an ice fisherman should tie a rope around the waist and to a fixed object on shore for

extra safety when fishing alone). Remember, upon falling through the ice, there are only a few minutes before hypothermia sets in. Make the most of this precious time and find the nearest solid ice and crawl/roll onto it to prevent breaking through again. If unable to exit the water, try to remain as calm as possible and form a "ball" with the body to conserve heat until help can arrive.

While ice fishing can be dangerous, when done correctly it is a great wintertime sport. These are only a few of the safety tips needed to know before heading onto the ice.
