

United States Census Bureau announces 2010 population count

The U.S. Census Bureau announced on Tuesday, December 21, that the 2010 Census showed the new resident population of the United States on April 1, 2010, was 308,745,538. The 2010 Census was the 23rd census in the nation's history.

The count reflects an increase of 9.7% over the 2000 census population of 281,421,906 (the second lowest percentage increase of the past century). The U.S. resident population represents the total number of people in the 50 states and the District of Columbia.

U.S. Commerce Secretary, Gary Locke, stated at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., when the official counts were unveiled, "A big thanks to the American public for its overwhelming response to the 2010 Census. The result was a successful count that came in on time and well under budget, with a final 2010 Census savings of \$1.87 billion."

Missouri's population was recorded at 5,988,927, an increase of only 7%, compared to the 2000 census total of 5,595,211. The total ranks Missouri 30th in size in the nation with 87.1 people per square mile.

Missouri to lose congressional seat

requires a change in apportionment, which is calculated by a congressionally defined formula. Apportionment is the process of dividing the 435 memberships, or seats, in the House of Representatives among the 50 states based on the population figures. Each member of the House represents, on average, about 710,767 people (which is up from the 646,952 persons at this time in 2000). With the new apportionment count, Missouri will lose a representative, moving from nine representatives to eight. As well as the loss of a congressional seat, Missouri will lose an Electoral state General Assembly is charged with redrawing the congressional district lines. In Northwest Missouri, Congressman Sam Graves represents 26 counties. Chances are, the district that includes St. Joseph and other counties in the northwill grow geographically.

The effect of the official 2010 population count at the state level on the Congressional Apportionment west grew by 2,534,225.

The new population count is a shift of 12 seats affecting 18 states. In addition to Missouri, other states losing representatives are: Illinois, Iowa, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New York (2), Ohio (2) and Pennsylvania. States gaining representatives are: Arizona, Florida (2), Georgia, Nevada, South Carolina, Texas (4), Utah and Washington.

> President Obama will transmit the apportionment count to the 112th Congress during the first week of its first regular session in January. The reapportioned Congress will be the 113th, which convenes in January 2013.

Letter to the editor



Dear Editor.

Enclosed is a picture and card from Dorothy "Dottie" Crouse. I am her sister and would like to explain the background for this

Dottie was born in 1946 and lived in Mound City with her parents, Paul and Ruth Crouse, until Paul retired in 1976. She was a beautiful child with blond curly hair and sky blue eyes. As a little sister, she was fun, funny and active, but aways managed to get into troublelike the time she pulled up all of Mrs. Buckle's potato plants because she thought they were weeds. Dottie was mildly mentally challenged and now that I have more knowledge, I believe she was autistic. She learned to read, but even managing to understand about money was beyond her. When she was eight, she had her first major seizure and was diagnosed with epilepsy. Now we know that the "flipping" of her eyes were small seizures. The doctor told my parents not to tell anyone. At that time, epilepsy had a bad stigma. I was in college then and researched how it related to education. One article I read said that children with epilepsy did not belong in school!

Because Dottie's handicap was mild and unusual, she was always under pressure to be "normal". At 12, she had a mental breakdown. She spent several years in the state hospital. Because of a reaction to one of her medicines, she almost died and had to have a tracheotomy. Mom spent many hours helping to suck phlegm from her lungs. After she recovered from the breakdown she lived quietly at home. The doctors said to put no pressure on her. She enjoyed her quiet life, reading, doing puzzles and crafts and visiting.

When Dad retired in 1976, the family moved to Phoenix, AZ, to be close to Mom's relatives. Dottie continued to enjoy her quiet life and the short trips around Arizona. In 1997, something happened to her and she had another mental breakdown. It

may have been triggered by the death of an aunt. Dottie developed an enlarged colon and had to have it removed. She now has an iliostomy. Dad and Mom put her in a nursing center close by where we visited her each day. She recovered and became better than ever. She responded to the social programs of the center and developed friendships. This lasted until Dad died in 1999. Six months later Dottie had kidney failure and was on dialysis for a while. Fortunately, her kidneys recovered, but her mind did not. She spent two months in the psychiatric ward of a hospital. After her release, she recovered and was "Dottie" again. I continued to visit her each day and take her on trips She became interested in attending church and wanted to be baptized. She was baptized in a small Phoenix Presbyterian Church.

In 2004, Mom died. As all of our relatives in Phoenix were gone, I moved us to Austin, TX, to be close to my daughter and two of my grandchildren. Dottie continued to do well and we joined a Presbyterian church that she selected. A little over six months later, she had another breakdown. We dealt with it in the nursing centers as she was not seen as a danger to herself or others. Last year, she had to have a small cancer removed from her right breast. She has never fully recovered, although, we see "Dottie" now and then. Two weeks ago, she had two long bad seizures. Since then, she has been calmer and I see "Dottie" almost every day.

Last week, Dottie wanted me to bring some cards. Among the cards I brought she picked out one. She said she wanted to send it to her friends in Mound City. Although I know this would include her aunt and uncle, Bob and Jean Crouse, I do not know who some of those friends would be as I left Mound City in 1953. Many of them, like her neighbor Mr. Armentrout, have probably passed away. So, I send this letter to you so you can tell her story and give Dottie's greetings to her friends.





Tree seedling order forms available at extension office





From the *Mound City News* archives

50 Years Ago - 1960

- The annual Christmas Ball was held at the Mound City School under variegated lights and a huge tinsel ball. Student council president, Bob Yates, crowned seniors Karen Browning and Roscoe Young as Mr. and Miss Christmas.
- The Mound City Panthers took third place in the Rock Port Tournament, beating Tarkio 49-38 and Bellevue 52-42. Max Goolsby, Dean Wilkinson and Tim Dougherty led the scoring and rebounding. The girls beat Savannah 32-21 and lost 47-28 to West Nodaway to earn second place. Janice Nixon and Rita Sharp led the scoring.
- The phrase, "Meanest Man in the World", described the person who broke into the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Kinney near Forest City, MO, and stole all of the wrapped presents from under the Christmas tree, along with silver, electric skillet, radio, pocket watch, coffee maker, shotgun and \$7 cash.
- An examination for postmaster at Craig, with a salary of \$5,370, opened for application.

25 Years Ago - 1985

- The Craig/Mound City water improvement project was the primary discussion at the city council meeting. Citizens attending felt it wise to construct the city's own plant. Opposition to the project made no headway at the time. The vote to proceed stood.
- Ice on the Missouri River was the cause of concern for residents. Ice jams near Atchison, KS, caused flood stage conditions north of the jam.
- The Mound City third graders hosted their parents for a Christmas production consisting of two plays, "The Forgotten Gift" and "Love-a-Tree Day"; a story, The Giving Tree; and three poems. Students included Amy Hinthorne, Dave Thompson, Amy Heck, Pamela Keeler, Joy Knapp, Brett Ungles, Josh Nauman, Troy Jones, Jeremy Rose, Tim Rose, Kerri Nauman, Hope Brown, Samantha Corbin, Pepper Traub, Jeremy Bammer, Missy Bundridge, Melanie Schlereth, Eric Brady, Bruce Lawson, Karla Guthals, Sarah Heck, Megan Wallace and Kevin Collins.
- The lottery that was approved by 70% of Missouri voters in November 1984, estimated that 65% of residents would play. Typical players were pegged to be between the ages of 35 and 54, with an income of \$18,000 to \$36,000 a year.

10 Years Ago - 2000

- Longtime Exchange Bank employees, Janet Burnsides and Sonny McCormack, retired. Janet worked in various positions at the bank in her 26-year career there. Sonny was just 16 when he began working at the bank, left for ten years after graduating, and returned to work at the bank following.
- The Holt County Christmas Toy Fund helped 41 families in Craig, Mound City, Oregon, Fortescue, Forest City, Skidmore, Maitland and Graham.
- John and Mary Lou Barrett's display of Christmas lights in Graham, MO, drew people from miles around. A night and day picture showed the massive display that had been growing for the past 23 years.
- County schools closed early for the Christmas break due to several inches of snow as well as wind chill temperatures reaching -40.
- Don and Joann Holstine's home won first place in the Mound City Mayor's Christmas Light Contest.

Community facilities are essential to the quality of life in any rural community. Through the Community Facilities Guaranteed Program of USDA Rural Development, guaranteed financing to a private lender is available to help communities meet the basic needs of citizens.

There are a variety of eligible loan purposes including: to construct, enlarge, or improve community facilities such as health care (clinics, ambulatory care centers, hospitals, rehabilitation centers and nursing homes); public safety (communication centers, police and fire stations, fire trucks, rescue vehicles, fire and rescue equipment and jails); public services (schools, child care centers, assisted living projects, nutrition centers, sheltered workshops, community centers and buildings, industrial park sites, airports, some recreation facilities, and libraries) and some in $frastructure\ including\ transportation$ facilities such as streets, roads, and bridges. 
