Debbie researched a company called Matter of Trust, whose mission is to link ideas. spark action and materialize sustainable systems. Matter of Trust officer's like to mimick how Mother Nature integrates enduring cycles and provide access to necessities in abundance. They concentrate on manmade surplus, natural surplus and eco-educational programs. The results are worthwhile, common-sensical and often enchanting.

One of those common sense ideas was the making of oil booms. These oil booms take recyclable nylons and fill them with hair, fur, fleece or feathbooms soak up the oil that is contaminating the water.

It was at that website that Debbie found a way to reuse the hair that is cut at her shop to help in "even a small way"

"People might think that a little salon can't really help ing would get done," stated

The project uses clean hair of any color, tint, length; vestigating about an idea she straight, curly, permed or straightened. All clippings must be free of any other garbage (gum, paper, clips, etc.).

Instead of picking up the hair traditionally, by broom and dustpan, Debbie sweeps the hair toward her "new toy", an EyeVac. The EyeVac is essentially an electric dustpan. When the hair is swept in front of the infrared sensors, the EyeVac will suction the hair into the canister instant-



Thanks Holt County for making the Cans for Cancer tank a

Thank you Holt County residents for your dedication to recycling.


"Having an office here will allow easier access for customers seeking rehabilitation or preventative type treatments," Cindy commented.

The plan includes taking out the parkway to allow for more room in front of the school and for incorporating possibly two offset retaining walls. The design will then be put out for public bids before the work of repairing the wall can begin.




"Nancy's Gang" make another lap
