Hot Relay for Life

Relay raises over \$16,500

A smaller crowd than usual flanked the courthouse lawn for the annual American Cancer Society Relay for Life event on Friday, June 4, in Oregon, MO, but contributions still reached exceptional level. With temperatures still hovering in the high eighties by 6:00 p.m., attendees, volunteers and teams were off to a hot start.

Relay for Life Chairwoman, Karen Cotton, welcomed everyone to the 2010 event. Mayor Bill McCully and Representative Mike Thomson both extended their thanks to those gathered in support of such a worthwhile event.

Thomson, who lost his father 32 years ago, remarked, "Small communities play a big role. The support and pride in the community are key, and the people of Northwest Missouri are the best people in the world."

After a prayer by Scott Schieb and the National Anthem sung beautifully by Lindsey

Vasquez, the American Legion units started the relay with the survivors' lap.

Around 25 of the over 100 cancer survivors in Holt County participated in the walk that evening.

The Ping Pong drop at 7:30 p.m. saw the kids scrambling to retrieve them and turn them in for treats.

Karen encouraged every-

one to continue to utilize the purple tank between Oregon and Forest City in the Cans for Cancer project. In 2009, 2,080 pounds were collected, but at only \$.30 a pound, totalled \$675. The site has collected 3,380 pounds of cans this year thus far.

The event raised in excess of \$16,500 for the American Cancer Society. Over 500 luminaries lined the courtyard perimeter, each with a canned food item in it, which was given to the Nancy Nauman Memorial Food Drive.

In addition, teams walked their laps, firemen cooked hamburgers and hot dogs, vocalists and bands entertained and gift baskets were silent auctioned as the spirit of the event trickled among those in attendance- those who desire to make a difference in the cure for cancer.

Local beautician does her part to help in the gulf

Debbie Sportsman, owner of Afterlooks in Mound City, along with her colleague, Joey Schueth, have been saving the hair cut in their shop to send to the gulf.

With deep empathy for the plight of those affected by the oil spill, Debbie did some investigating about an idea she saw in a television news program.

Debbie researched a company called Matter of Trust, whose mission is to link ideas, spark action and materialize sustainable systems. Matter of Trust officer's like to mimic how Mother Nature integrates enduring cycles and provide access to necessities in abundance. They concentrate on manmade surplus, natural surplus and eco-educational programs. The results are worthwhile, common-sensical and often enchanting.

One of those common sense ideas was the making of oil booms. These oil booms take recyclable nylons and fill them with hair, fur, fleece or feathers. Placed in the ocean, these booms soak up the oil that is contaminating the water.

It was at that website that Debbie found a way to reuse the hair that is cut at her shop to help in "even a small way"

with the crisis in the gulf. "People might think that a little salon can't really help that much, but if everyone had that attitude, then nothing would get done," stated Debbie Sportsman.

The project uses clean hair of any color, tint, length, straight, curly, permed or straightened. All clippings must be free of any other garbage (gum, paper, clips, etc.). Instead of picking up the hair traditionally, by broom and dustpan, Debbie sweeps the hair toward her "new toy", an EyeVac. The EyeVac is essentially an electric dustpan. When the hair is swept in front of the infrared sensors, the EyeVac will suction the hair into the canister instantly.

Besides the benefit of helping with the huge oil spill, which, as of May 13, was still spilling 210,000 gallons a day into the ocean, Debbie said it also minimizes her trash volume.

"When I tell my customers that their hair is going to the gulf, they think it's pretty cool," remarked Debbie.

The hair collected is then bagged, boxed and will be sent to Ft. Walton Beach, FL, to be made into oil booms.

Dawghouse Bar and Grill opens in Forest City

Tim and Annie Slagle of Forest City, MO, opened The Dawghouse Bar and Grill last week at 110 Commercial Street.

The street, also known to locals as Dog Street for the past 50 years or so because of all the dogs there, was the springboard for the new business' name and decorative touches.

Tim, a 1983 Mound City graduate, who is also employed with Allison Bail Bonds and his wife, Annie, a nurse at Western Reception, Diagnostic and Correctional Center in St. Joseph, MO, had always enjoyed the Mint, the business next door, which closed its doors in 2009.

So, in March of 2010, the

couple, along with business partner, Chris Phillips, purchased the building known as the Whistle Stop, adjacent to the Mint.

Historically, the building was known as Shelton's Pool Hall in the early 60's and housed Bonnie's Fabrics in the late 60's. In the mid 70's, Rodrick-Dryden Ceramics operated its business there for over 25 years. Francis Scroggins, owner of the Mint, expanded into the building and made it the Whistle Stop.

The new owners wanted to be able to offer a place with good food at good prices, so they got to work creating the Dawghouse. Tim, Annie, and Chris, along with a multitude of family

and friends, went to work giving the place a facelift.

With much time and materials invested, they watched as the quiet opening on Wednesday, June 2, saw 103 meals sell with only "word of mouth advertising".

The Dawghouse offers a full line of sandwich and basket selections, including tenderloins, and will try new items every three months to see how customers like them. The grill will stay open each night until 11:00 p.m.

With a town population of 338, Forest City's Main Street is once again lined with cars, with the passengers likely headed for the Dawghouse.

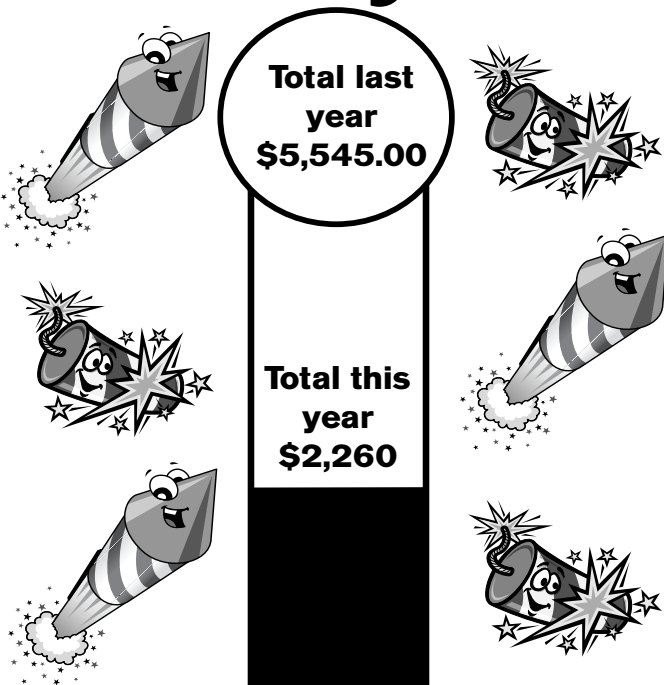

Letter to the Editor,

Thanks Holt County for making the Cans for Cancer tank a success.

Three years ago, the Relay for Life team, Night Owls, created the tank as a moneymaking project. No one involved realized the quantity of cans that would be collected. The first year, with only six months of operation, the tank collected 740 pounds of aluminum cans, last year 2,080 pounds, and this year 3,380 pounds. With cans varying in price from 33 cents to 57 cents a pound, the tank has made a total of \$2,781 for the American Cancer Society. All monies from the tank are donated; nothing is held back for transportation, supplies or labor.

The relay team appreciates the Nutrition Center at Mound City and Dee Hughes at Forest City for serving as collection sites. All cans help fill the tank, from the five left by the Fed Ex truck last week to the huge black plastic bags dropped off by people who take the time to save, drive by, and drop off. One of the team members has often said, "What did the people do with all those cans before the tank?" The answer is probably "most of them were tossed in the trash." Thank you Holt County residents for your dedication to recycling.

The Cans for Cancer tank is located on Highway 111 between Forest City and Oregon at the driveway entrance of Dannar Welding. If no one is there, just stop, leave your cans and be on your way.

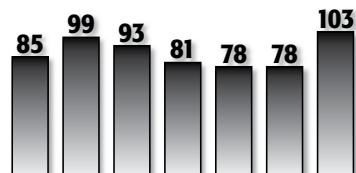

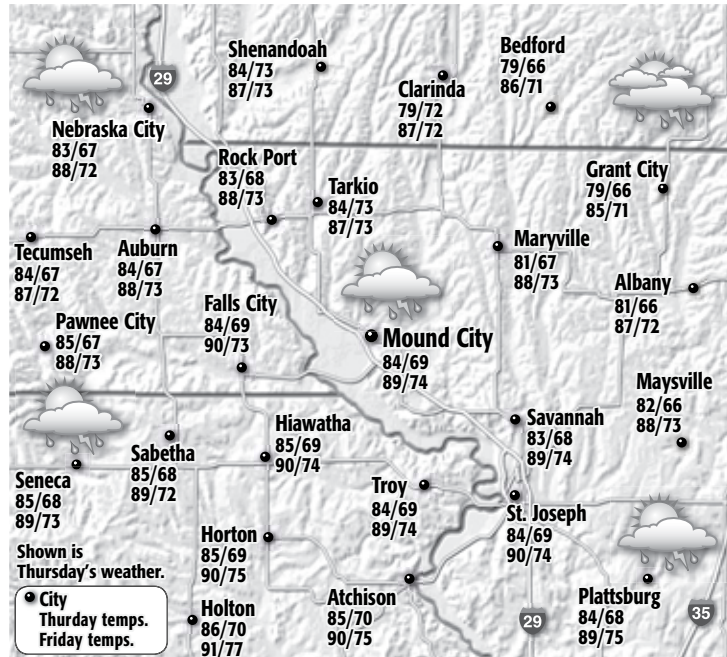
