## Shots must be completed before school starts

Holt County School nurse, Susan Lentz, is again reminding parents that immunization boosters must be completed before the first day of school on Wednesday, August 18, 2010, in order to attend. JH/HS students needing their Tdap boosters received letters in the mail from the nurse in March. All incoming 8th graders are due this vaccine unless they have received one in the past two years.

The Holt County Health Department in Oregon, MO, is hosting a free walk-in clinic for JH/HS students to receive their Tdap on Thursday, August 5, from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Preschool/Kindergarten entries were notified at screening/roundup what vaccines were needed for school entrance.

New students need to bring their immunization records when they enroll.

Asthma action plans and medication forms for students carrying their own inhalers are available at Northwest Health Services, enrollment and through Mrs. Lentz. Immunization information is also available through Northwest Health Services locations and the Holt County Health Department.

## Primary Election to be held Tuesday, August 3

The Primary Election will be held in Holt County on Tuesday, August 3, 2010, at appointed polling places throughout the county with polls open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Townships and locations are as follow:

- Lincoln-Union Township at the Nazarene Church in Craig
- Clay Township at the Nodaway-Holt School in Maitland
- Bigelow-Minton Township at the City Hall in Mound City
- Benton-Liberty Township at the City Hall in Mound City
- Forest Township at the City Hall in Forest City
- Lewis-Hickory, Nodaway-Forbes Township at the TJ Hall Building in Oregon

Candidates in the Democratic, Republican, Libertarian and Constitution parties stand largely unopposed in their party, with the exception

being the U.S. Senate race.

In the U.S. Senate race, 17 candidates are seeking votes which will foster their seat on the November ballot.

Republicans Sam Graves and Christopher Ryan are the only race for U.S. Representative District 6 seat.

With the exception of State Auditor, party candidates for State Representative District 4 and State Senator District 12 stand unopposed.

Locally, candidates are running solely on the Republican ticket and seats for Associate Circuit Judge, Presiding Commissioner, County Clerk, Circuit Clerk and Exofficio Recorder, Treasurer and Prosecuting Attorney are running unopposed.

Donna Cotton and Cindy Wohlford are vying for County Collector, to fill the position of Billy Paul Sharp, who is retiring.

All registered voters need to be sure to exercise their right to vote Tuesday, August 3.



**A new levee, south of Craig-** Was thrown up by area farmers July 22-23, west of the Gail Voltmer residence and extending toward the north. It is hoped that the levee will protect the land and homes from reoccurring high river levels. Flood waters destroyed crops and damaged homes in the area in the early June flooding.

## New levee district proposed

An informational meeting of landowners and others was held at the Craig Legion Hall on Tuesday, July 20, with the purpose of discussing a proposed new levee district, south of Craig.

Farmers/landowners Johnny Haer, Steve Cunningham and Robert Drewes have begun researching and are looking at two options for forming a new levee district to protect the Craig bottom from future flood waters.

The proposed levee district would have boundaries beginning at the north edge of Hwy. 111, come around the south edge of Craig and follow Interstate 29 to the Little Tark River, down the Tark River to Road 190 and back west to the Missouri River (behind the Darrel Voltmer home). The district will start where District 10 ends and run across the high bank.

The proposed levee district project would protect and use as a tax base 11,000 to 14,000 acres.

Those present were informed that after speaking to and securing an attorney, the group has two options for pursuing the project.

Option 1 has the project petitioning the Circuit Court and Option 2 is by means of the County Commission.

The understood protocol for each option was addressed before the group, with no decision being reached, as the

group was set to meet with the County Commission on Wednesday, July 21.

Start-up fees, voting rights of landowners and concerns over the placement of the levee were voiced. No concrete answers were available for levee placement, as engineers hold the responsibility of drawing up the actual plans for the levee.

"So basically, we're still in limbo," stated Jim Ohlensehlen, who wanted more concrete answers about the levee placement that would likely be placed on his ground.

A period for comments and questions was entertained, with the group planning to hold a publicized meeting in the near future.

Since that meeting, a temporary levee was constructed behind the Gail Voltmer residence and to the north through Steve Cunningham's land by a group of local farmers. The levee should potentially protect against a 24-25 foot river. Water was already at the back of the levee by Monday morning, July 26.

After the Wednesday meeting with the County Commissioners, it was reported that steps are being taken to proceed through the commission's format for incorporating a new levee district. The group is working with the attorney to get a legal description of potential Levee District 15 and a petition process started.

## Refuge benefits as two summer YCC teams help prepare for anniversary

With the President's initiative to get local youth working on conservation projects, Squaw Creek National Wildlife Refuge was able to apply for and welcome two teams from the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) to the refuge this summer.

Two YCC teams, consisting of a leader and four members each, have been diligently working at the refuge for the past eight weeks. Their labor has helped ready the refuge for its 75th anniversary this fall. Team members have painted, done invasive weed control, helped in many and various general maintenance projects and lastly created a new viewing site at Pintail Pond.

"We turn every work situation into something fun," stated team member Brooke Voltmer.

"There is something new every day and it makes

things interesting," commented Ashley Graupman, team member. "I love the outdoors, I couldn't work inside."

In addition to their labor, team members were required to participate in 40 hours of environmental education, which has given them some unique opportunities. They participated in electroshocking with the Department of Conservation, observed at the DeSoto Natural Wildlife Refuge north of Omaha, performed dove banding, attended the Goose Roundup at Pony Express Lake and shadowed a hydrologist from Minneapolis who was at the refuge with his equipment to test water quality and quantity.

The teams were finishing a memorial project that they constructed at Pintail Pond on Monday. From the concrete slab to setting the

heavy scope, the team made the project happen.

Tyler Eaton, a team member who travelled from Falls City, NE, all summer stated proudly of the Grignon project, "This is a neat project. It'll be nice to say, 'Hey, I helped build that'."

The project was made possible by contributions from the Peter Grignon family. Peter and his family, who own property near Pintail Pond, are avid waterfowl hunters. Team members equipped the viewing area with a bench, scope and interpretive sign. Additionally, a rock with a plaque will honor Peter Grignon at the site and be dedicated in September.

The team members were pleased with their work at the refuge this summer. They enjoyed camaraderie, pride in workmanship and a keen appreciation for wildlife and their habitats.

## Maitland Fire Department receives matching grant

The Maitland Volunteer Fire Department received a check for \$1,934 during the week of July 19, as part of the Volunteer Fireman Assistance Matching Grants program.

The check was presented to Fire Chief Bryan Markt by Missouri Department of Conservation Forestry Division Resource Assistant, Caleb Gentry. The funds are provided by the U.S. Forest Service and the Missouri Department of Conservation.

Fire Chief Bryan Markt applied for and received the matching grant monies. The grant was approved and items were purchased for the district. The check was then received and presented as reimbursement for the items.

The district used the grant to purchase one complete turnout gear, two handheld radios and three pagers.

"It's a really good program," stated Bryan. "It allows us to keep up with our equipment."

One hundred sixty-nine fire departments will be receiving checks of up to \$3,000 to help them with the purchase of personal protective gear and firefighting equipment for wildfires as well as structure fires. The total funding for fire department matching grants this year is \$373,585.

During the last 28 years, nearly \$5,904,429 has been distributed to Rural Fire Departments to help them increase the safety of their fighters and provide them with better firefighting equipment.

This is the second year that the district has received this grant. They are excited to have the opportunity to keep their equipment up to date.

## General True attends 60th class reunion at West Point

Retired Brigadier Everett L. True, formerly of Craig, MO, recently attended the 60th reunion of his 1950 graduation from West Point. Traveling with General True to the United States Military Academy in New York was Jeanne Garst, Watson MO, four of General True's daughters; two sons-in-laws; and one granddaughter.

The three day celebration included a reception party, class memorial service, superintendent's briefing and meeting, alumni luncheon, Hudson River Cruise, West Point campus tour, class dinner dance and an Alumni exercise, parade and luncheon. General True was one of 171 classmates out of 670 1950 graduates that attended the reunion.

General True's West Point class graduated on June 6, 1950, eighteen days before the invasion of South Korea. Including General True, more than half of the class saw combat action in Korea and sustained the highest casualty rate of any West Point class in this century. The 1950 class is the first class since the Civil War that sent graduates directly to combat units without first attending further training in their basic branches.

From the ranks of the class of 1950 came 64 generals, including Chiefs of Staff of both the Army and the Air Force in the 1980's. One classmate commanded the first spacecraft in circumlunar orbit in 1968 and another was elected President of the Philippines in the 1990's. Hundreds of others served our nation and communities with notable distinction both in the military and later. Per the class historian, the 1950 class

provided loyal, effective, enduring and selfless service, often of rare quality.

General True graduated from Fairfax High School in Fairfax, MO, in 1945 and attended Wentworth Military Academy of Lexington, MO, for a year prior to his application to West Point. General True also served in the Vietnam War, at the Air Logistics Center and Deputy Chief of Staff for Plans, Headquarters Air Training Command at Randolph AFB, TX. General True retired April 1, 1979, and resides in Mesa, AZ.

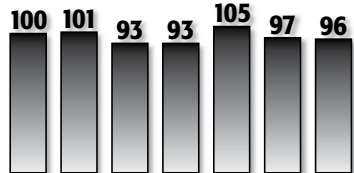

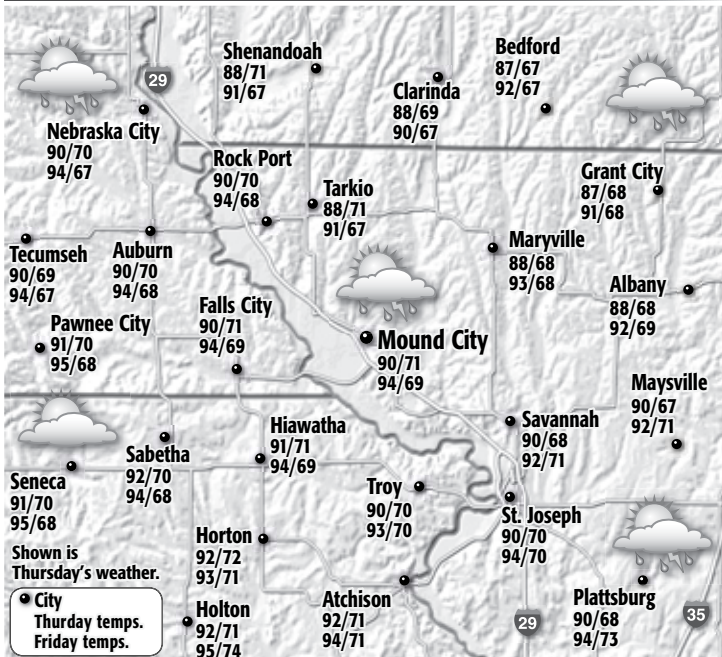

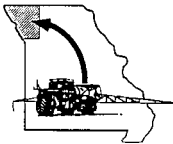

## Wet weather and hot temperatures stress area crops

The wet weather has caused many of the crops to be shallow rooted and with hot temperatures, crops are stressed. The rain has been abundant and water is seeping out of the hillsides and in river bottoms, and the crops are yellow due to saturated soils.

The wet weather has resulted in shallow crop roots. Roots do not grow deep into soils saturated with water. Saturated soils cause a lack of oxygen in the soil as all the voids are filled with water. Roots need oxygen to grow and take up nutrients and water.

Roots will move deeper as water percolates deeper into the soil. This allows for oxygen to move into the soil filling the voids left from downward moving water. Roots of crops that remain in saturated soils will grow very poorly and exhibit nutrient deficiencies. Plants are not able to take up adequate amounts of nutrients.

Now combine the shallow crop roots with hot weather. Hot temperature conditions increase plant respiration.

The plant respiration rate doubles for every 13 degrees F according to Dr. Thomison, Ohio State Extension. This rapid respiration requires increased nutrient and water uptake which shallow roots can adequately supply. Plants may wilt under these conditions even though there is plenty of water.

Also, hot nights cause the plants to use sugars from photosynthesis made during daylight to be used for respiration at night. This means there is less sugar available for developing kernels. This energy is used by the plant for respiration. Dr. Wiebold, University of Missouri Extension, indicated that ideal night temperatures to maximize yields of both corn and soybeans are in the mid-60s.

The highest yields in northwest Missouri are during times of adequate, timely rains and cool nighttime temperatures. However, this year, there is a lot of variability of crop conditions which will impact harvest yields. In places that were planted early year and have good water drainage, there are outstanding crops; whereas in other fields, where water has injured crops, harvest yields will be severely reduced.

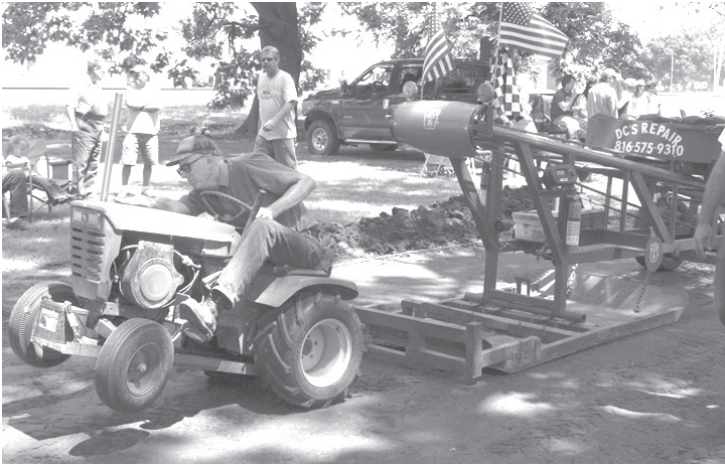

# Holt County Commission minutes

## Treasurer reported 6-month balances down

The Holt County Commission met Monday, July 19, 2010, at 9:00 a.m. with Presiding Commissioner Mark Sitherwood, First District Commissioner Bill Gordon and Second District Commissioner Don Holstine present.

After review, Commissioner Gordon made a motion to accept the minutes as written by County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Holstine.

Ronnie Atkins, City of Oregon, appeared before the commission to notify commissioners that the City Council of Oregon has decided to restrict semi-truck and tractor parking on the square. Mr. Atkins will be installing signs in the coming weeks around the square.

Brenda Nelson, R.N., Health Department Administrator, reported on cuts to State of Missouri funding for MCH, WIC and CORE programs. Discussion was held on the Heart and Stroke contracts for 2011 and sanitation services.

Treasurer Gay Quick appeared with the six-month settlement of funds. Commissioners reviewed fund balances and compared them with prior years. The General Revenue fund reflects

a loss in cash of \$164,163 over the cash on hand of \$400,145 on June 30, 2009, to \$235,981 on June 30, 2010. The Road and Bridge Fund is down \$248,971 from June 30, 2009, balance of \$343,987 to a cash balance of \$95,016 on June 30, 2010. Both funds have seen significant cash reduction due to economic conditions in the State of Missouri through lost sales tax revenue, loss of state and federal funding and increased expenses for winter blizzards and recent flooding.

Ed Kurtz, rural Oregon, approached the commission to request assistance for Holt Road 340 which joins Andrew County in the Monkey Mountain area. The Nodaway River is cutting toward the roadway on the Andrew County segment of the road, and there are concerns that the road will be closed soon. The commission has spoken to the Andrew County Commission about the issue in the past. Recent flooding and high river levels have caused more damage.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Daryl Biermann appeared before the commission to review the operating budget and to discuss upcoming debris removal and flood repairs.

Diana Phillips, Big Lake Village Clerk, met with the commission to review recent flooding and clean-up issues and to finalize plans for the use of the county emergency trailer as her temporary office at Big Lake.

Wayne Flanary, University Extension Agronomist, discussed crop damage issues with the commission.

Commissioners approved the use of the gazebo and courtyard grounds for the Oregon Public Library on Sunday, August 8, 2010.

Commissioner Sitherwood opened the 2010 Board of Equalization. Being no scheduled appointments, the board stands open until Friday, July 30, 2010. Assessor Carla Markt has provided the assessed valuation of all real estate and personal property to County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel for review by the commission. Board of Equalization appeals from the 2009 tax year are ongoing with Golden Triangle Energy. The next hearing date was set for Thursday, July 29, at 10:00 a.m. in the courtroom.

Being no further business, the commission adjourned pending new flooding concerns for the remainder of the week.


