

Informal News Beat Rainy 4th



Treasurer Dave Frede gave a financial report, noting that funds continue to come in toward the Benne Scholarship.



Emergency Conservation Program now available

Jackie VanGundy, County Executive Director of US-DA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Holt County reminds producers to contact the office before beginning any restoration work for land damaged by the flood.

Mound City

USDA Farm Service Agency provides emergency funding for farmers to rehabilitate farmland damaged by natural disasters such as flooding. ECP cost share practices include: removing debris from farmland and grading, shaping; re-leveling farmland; and restoring conservation structure and installations.

Based on a site visit, FSA will determine eligibility of land for ECP.

Subject to availability of funds, ECP participants may receive cost-share assistance of up to 75% of the cost to implement approved

ECP practices. Eligible participants are subject to a payment limitation. Funding for ECP is appropriated by Congress so it is not an entitlement program where eligible producers are guaranteed funding.

Holt County has not been approved for the ECP program at this point; however, FSA is required to inspect the damage before the work is done to be eligible.

So please contact the office before beginning any restoration work!
